### DAISY JOURNEYS

---

#### **It's Your World - Change It!**

Daisies learn about Girl Scout history and traditions through an adventure starring Amazing Daisy. The program involves gardening, a perennial favorite of girls at this level.

#### **It's Your Planet - Love It!**

During this armchair cross-country road trip, girls learn the values of the Girl Scout Law and explore the natural world around them.

### DAISY MEETINGS AND PATCHES

---

A typical Daisy meeting consists of games, songs, crafts and more, including attending council programs.



Daisies can earn petal patches to wear on their uniform tunic. Each petal represents a part of the Girl Scout Law, like respect, honesty, helpfulness and caring. They earn the center for learning the Girl Scout Promise. Girls learn these concepts cooperatively, so they make new friends and try new things together.

### Mission

Girl Scouting builds girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place.

### Membership

Girl Scouts is open to all girls in grades K-12, and women and men age 18 and over, who accept the Girl Scout Promise and Law. National membership dues are \$12 per year, which goes entirely to Girl Scouts of the USA in New York.

### Girl Scout Promise

On my honor, I will try: to serve God\* and my country, to help people at all times, and to live by the Girl Scout Law.

### Girl Scout Law

I will do my best to be honest and fair, friendly and helpful, considerate and caring, courageous and strong, and responsible for what I say and do, and to respect myself and others, respect authority, use resources wisely, make the world a better place, and be a sister to every Girl Scout.

### Nearly 100 Years

Juliette Gordon Low founded the organization on **March 12, 1912**, in Savannah, Georgia.

### Still Growing Strong

There are 45,000 girl and 17,000 adult members in Girl Scouts of Eastern Massachusetts. They are among the 2.7 million girl and 928,000 adult members of Girl Scouts of the USA.

### The Girl Scout Leadership Experience

The Girl Scouts Research Institute's landmark study, *Change It Up!*, found that girls want to lead by inspiration rather than authority. The Girl Scout Leadership Experience is inclusive and empowering, encouraging cooperative learning through program Journeys of activities and adventures that build leadership. In the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, girls in grades K-12 discover their values, connect to their communities, and take action to make the world better. Girl Scout activities are girl-led, and include exploration of the environment, careers, science and technology, healthy lifestyles, the arts and more. Girls learn beginning entrepreneurship, marketing and goal-setting through the Girl Scout Cookie Sale.

Girl Scouts welcomes girls of all religions, opinions, sexual orientations, races, ethnicities and socio-economic levels – we are totally inclusive and embrace diversity as an organizational culture.
